Crochet Tutorial: Hello Kitty Appliqué and Star Motif

This tutorial provides instructions for crocheting the **Hello Kitty head appliqué** and the **small star motif** shown in the image, based on the provided crochet charts.

Important Note: Crochet charts use symbols to represent stitches. The following instructions are an interpretation of the charts using standard U.S. crochet terms.

Key to Crochet Symbols (US Terms)

Symbo I	Stitch	Abbreviatio n	Notes
0	Chain	ch	Also used for starting with a Magic Ring/Circle.
	Slip Stitch	sl st	Used for joining rounds.

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Colors Used:

- White or Cream for the main head.
- Red for the bow and nose.
- **Black** for the whiskers and outline (this is often embroidered or done with a slip stitch border).

1. Hello Kitty Head Appliqué

This is worked in **rounds**, starting from the center of the head.

Materials

- Yarn in White/Cream (for the head).
- Yarn in **Red** (for the nose and bow).
- Small amount of **Black** yarn or embroidery floss (for the whiskers and outline).
- Crochet hook appropriate for your yarn weight.
- Yarn needle for weaving in ends and embroidery.

Instructions (White/Cream Yarn)

Round 1: Starting the Center

- 1. **Magic Ring** (MR) or **ch 4** and join with a sl st to form a ring.
- 2. Ch 2 (counts as first hdc, or just as a starting chain).
- 3. Work **8 hdc** into the ring.
- 4. Join with a **sl st** to the first hdc (or the top of the ch-2). (≈ 8 sts). (The chart shows a circle of stitches around the center hole.)

Round 2: Building the Base

- 1. **Ch 1** (does not count as a stitch).
- 2. Work **2 sc** into each stitch around. (≈ 16 sts).
- 3. Join with a **sl st** to the first sc. (The chart shows 'T' symbols (sc) with 'V' shapes (increases), suggesting a round of increases.)

Round 3: Shaping the Head

- 1. Ch 1.
- 2. Work a sequence of increasing stitches: The chart shows a mix of **sc**, **hdc**, and **dc**. Follow this sequence for one section and repeat it around.
 - Work a combination of single crochets and increases (2 sts in one st) to get a slight oval shape.
 - Interpretation based on the chart: The chart suggests a pattern like: (sc, inc in next st) repeated a few times, then moving to hdc and dc to widen the bottom of the head, and then back to sc.
 - Alternative simplified Round 3: (sc in next st, 2 sc in next st) repeat 8 times around. (24 sts).

Rounds 4 & 5: Adding Ears and Final Shaping

- The final rounds involve changing stitch heights (**sc**, **hdc**, **dc**) to create the distinctive **ear peaks** and the curved bottom of the head. The colors in the chart (green and blue symbols) often just denote a change of row/round or section, not necessarily a color change in the yarn.
- 1. Work stitches according to the varying heights in the chart:
 - Start with **sl sts** and **sc** around the top edge.
 - o For the **ears**, work a section of **hdc** and **dc** stitches to make a peak.
 - o Continue with **sc** and **hdc** for the side.
 - Work the bottom section with **dc** and **hdc** to create the curve.
 - The second ear is worked with a peak of **hdc** and **dc**.
 - Finish with sc back to the beginning.
- 2. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Finishing Touches

 Red Nose: Embroider a small oval or triangle shape for the nose using Red yarn or floss.

- Whiskers: Use Black yarn/floss to embroider three whiskers on each side of the face.
- Outline: The black dashed line around the head suggests a final slip stitch border
 or an outline done with a backstitch using Black yarn/floss to make the appliqué
 pop.

2. Red Bow

This is a small, separate motif worked in rows or rounds. The chart shows a small **four-pointed shape**.

Instructions (Red Yarn)

- 1. Ch 4.
- 2. SI st into the first ch to form a small ring.

Forming the Petals/Points:

- 1. Ch 3 (counts as first dc).
- 2. Work **2 dc** into the ring.
- 3. Ch 3, sl st into the ring. (First point made)
- 4. Ch 3, work 2 dc into the ring.
- 5. Ch 3, sl st into the ring. (Second point made)
- 6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 two more times to get four points (total).
- 7. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Note: This interpretation creates a small 4-petal flower, which is a common shape for Hello Kitty's bow in crochet.

Assembly

• Sew the **Red Bow** onto the **upper left ear** of the Hello Kitty head.

3. Star Motif

This is a small, separate **5-pointed star** motif.

Instructions (Any Color Yarn)

Round 1: Starting the Center

- 1. Magic Ring (MR) or ch 4 and join with a sl st to form a ring.
- 2. Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch).
- 3. Work **10 sc** into the ring.

4. Join with a **sl st** to the first sc. (10 sts).

Round 2: Creating the Points The chart shows a sequence repeated **5 times** to create 5 points.

- 1. (SI st in the next st (this is optional for positioning))
- 2. Ch 3 (counts as one chain for height).
- 3. Work 1 dc into the same stitch.
- 4. Ch 3.
- 5. **SI st** into the 3rd chain from the hook (this creates a **picot** for the star point).
- 6. **Dc** back into the same initial stitch (or the next stitch, depending on interpretation).
- 7. SI st into the next two stitches.
- 8. Repeat steps 2-7 four more times for a total of 5 points.
- 9. Join with a **sl st** to the start.

Alternative Simplified Star Point (5 Points):

- 1. *SI st in the next st.
- 2. Ch 4.
- 3. Work dc in the 3rd ch from hook (or 2nd ch from hook).
- 4. Work **hdc** in the next ch.
- 5. **Sc** in the next ch.
- 6. SI st in the next sc on Round 1.
- 7. Repeat from * four more times.

Fasten off and weave in ends.
