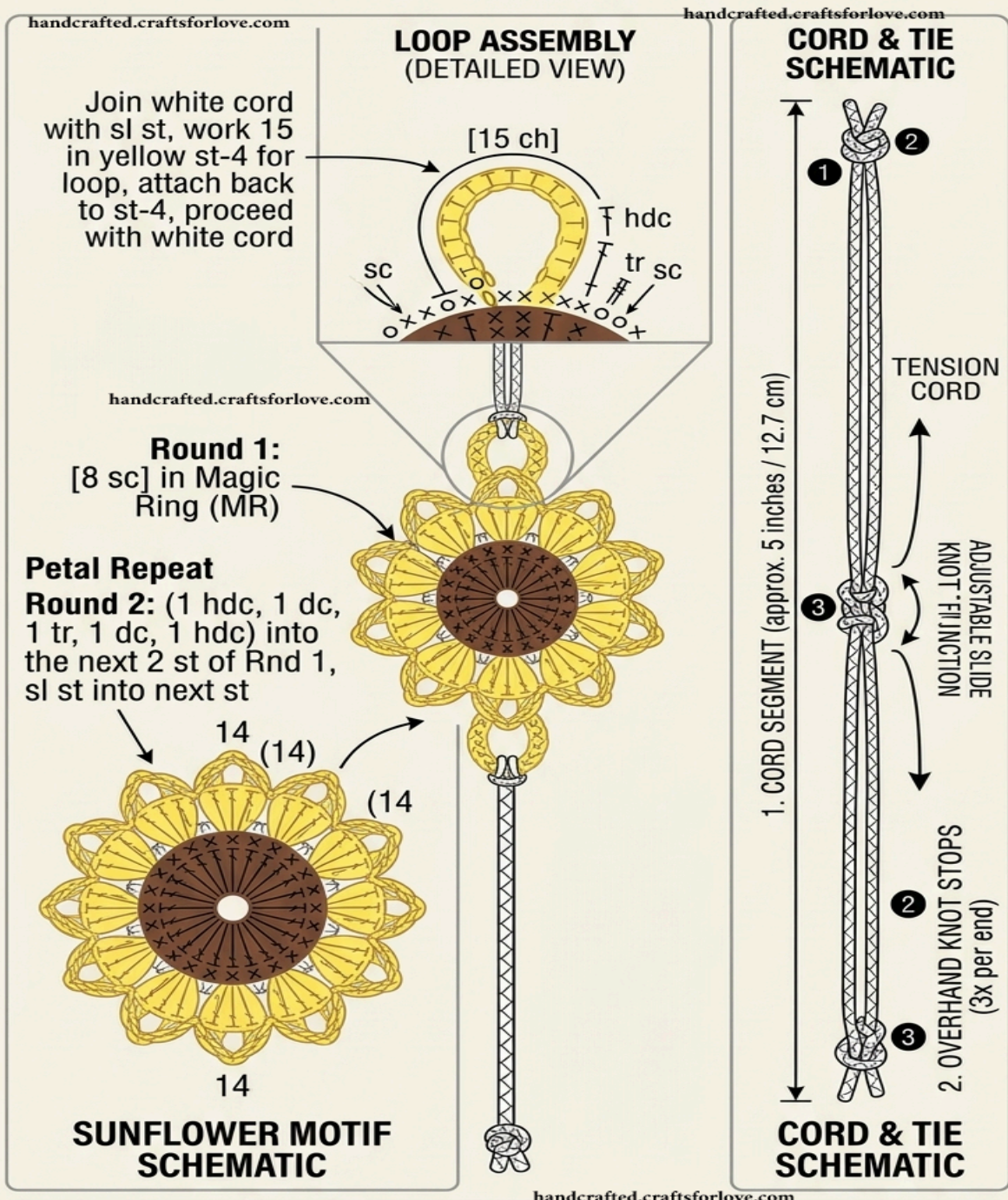


☀️ Sunflower Bracelet Crochet Tutorial (US Terms)

This step-by-step guide is based entirely on the diagram you provided. It follows US crochet terminology and is written so beginners can confidently complete the bracelet from start to finish. <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> **SEE THE BEST PATTERNS**

SUNFLOWER BRACELET TECHIICAL DIAGRAM (US CROCHET STITCHES)



STITCH SYMBOL & ABBREVIATION KEY: ch=chain, sc=single crochet, ○=ch, x̄=hdc, Ɔ=crochet, hdc=half double crochet, dc=double crochet, tr= treble crochet, sl st=slip stitch, MR=Magic Ring, rep=repeat.

NOTES: Adjust cord segment lengths for desired wrist size. All tie knots are manual overhand and sliding knots, as marked.



Materials You'll Need

- Yellow yarn (petals)
- Brown yarn (center)
- White yarn or cord (bracelet + loop)
- Crochet hook (size appropriate for your yarn, typically 3.0–4.0 mm)
- Scissors
- Yarn needle (optional for finishing)



Stitch Abbreviations (US Terms)

- ch = chain <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> SEE THE BEST PATTERNS
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- sl st = slip stitch
- MR = magic ring
- rep = repeat



Step 1: Create the Sunflower Center

Start with brown yarn. <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> SEE THE BEST PATTERNS

- Make a **Magic Ring (MR)**
- Work **8 sc** into the ring
- Pull tight to close
- Join with a **sl st** into the first stitch

You now have a small circular base.



Step 2: Crochet the Petals (Round 2)

Switch to yellow yarn.

Each petal is worked across **2 stitches from Round 1**, then anchored with a slip stitch.

Repeat this pattern all the way around:

- *(1 hdc, 1 dc, 1 tr, 1 dc, 1 hdc)* into the next 2 stitches
- sl st into the next stitch

Repeat this sequence until you complete the circle.

You should end up with **14 petals total** 🌻

Step 3: Repeat Around

Continue the petal pattern evenly across all stitches.

- Ensure each petal is anchored with a slip stitch
- Maintain consistent spacing
- At the end, join with a sl st

Fasten off yellow yarn. <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> **SEE THE BEST PATTERNS**

Step 4: Create the Top Loop

Attach white cord/yarn to the top of one petal.

- Join with a **sl st** into stitch #4 (as shown in diagram)
- **ch 15** to form a loop
- Work back along the chain with stitches such as:
 - sc, hdc, and tr (as indicated in diagram for structure)
- Attach the loop back to the same base stitch using a **sl st**

This creates a sturdy loop for the bracelet closure.

Step 5: Attach the Bottom Cord

Attach white cord at the bottom of the sunflower.

- Secure yarn with a knot
- This will be one side of the bracelet cord

Step 6: Create the Bracelet Cords

Cut **two white cords**, approximately:

- **5 inches (12.7 cm)** each (or longer for larger wrists)

Attach both cords securely to the bottom of the sunflower.

Step 7: Make the Adjustable Sliding Knot

This is what allows the bracelet to open and close.

- Cross the two cords
- Take one cord and wrap it around the other cord several times
- Tie a **sliding knot (adjustable knot)**
- Repeat on the opposite side if needed

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This creates a center section that slides to tighten or loosen.

Step 8: Tie End Knots

At the ends of each cord: <https://handcrafted.craftsforlove.com/> **SEE THE BEST PATTERNS**

- Tie **overhand knots (3 per end)**
- This prevents fraying and adds a decorative finish

Step 9: Final Adjustments

- Adjust cord lengths for comfort
- Tighten all knots securely
- Trim excess yarn if needed

Your bracelet should now slide smoothly and sit comfortably on your wrist.

- A 14-petal sunflower motif
- A structured top loop closure
- Adjustable sliding cord system

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
