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Complete Crochet Tutorial Based on the Chart

This step-by-step guide walks you through creating the full project shown in the chart: canopy top, panels, bed base, border, and tassels. It uses standard US crochet terminology and is written so beginners and intermediate crocheters can follow confidently.

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Materials & Tools

- Worsted weight yarn (or similar size shown in chart)
- Crochet hook size G/6 (4.0 mm) or size needed to match gauge
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch markers (optional but helpful)



Stitch Abbreviations (US Terms)

- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- dc = double crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- sl st = slip stitch
- shell = multiple stitches in one space (usually 5 dc unless noted)
- picot = ch 3, sl st into first ch
- popcorn = multiple dc closed together in same stitch



Step 1: Canopy Top (Rounds 1–10)

This is worked in the round from the center outward.

Round 1

- Make a magic ring (or ch 4, sl st to form a loop)
- Ch 3 (counts as first dc), work 11 dc into ring
- Join with sl st to top of ch 3 (12 stitches total)

Round 2

- Ch 3
- 2 dc in each stitch around
- Join (24 dc)

Round 3

- Ch 3
- 1 dc in next stitch, 2 dc in next stitch repeat around
- Join (36 dc)

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Round 4

- Ch 3
- 1 dc in next 2 stitches, 2 dc in next stitch repeat
- Join (48 dc)

Round 5

- Continue increasing evenly (add 1 dc between increases each round)
- Follow chart for placement

Rounds 6–10

- Maintain circular growth
- Introduce shell stitches and decorative spacing as shown
- Pay attention to increase placement markers in chart

Tip 😊: Keep your circle flat. If it curls, loosen tension or go up a hook size.



Step 2: Establish Pattern Texture

From the chart, you'll start incorporating:

- Shell stitches in designated spaces
- Chain spaces between groups
- Occasional picots or popcorn stitches for texture

Work exactly where symbols appear in each round. The pattern builds outward symmetrically.



Step 3: Canopy Panels (Make 4)

Each panel is square and worked flat in rows.

Row 1

- Ch foundation chain to match chart width
- Work dc across

Row 2

- Turn
- Begin incorporating shells and chain spaces

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Rows 3–7

- Follow panel chart closely
- Maintain symmetry on both sides
- Use stitch markers if needed

Row 8+

- Continue decorative pattern repeats
- Finish square evenly

Tip: Count stitches at the end of each row to stay consistent.

Step 4: Joining Panels

- Arrange 4 panels in a square
- Use slip stitch or whip stitch to seam edges together
- Align pattern so designs flow correctly

Seaming Tip 😊: Work through both loops for a sturdy join.

Step 5: Bed Base (Large Rectangle)

This section forms the main base.

Foundation

- Chain to desired width (based on chart proportions)

Rows

- Work rows of dc or sc evenly
- Continue until length matches chart

Edge Preparation

- Once rectangle is complete, work one round of sc evenly around entire edge
- Place 3 sc in each corner

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Step 6: Border & Edge Detail

This is the decorative edge shown around the base.

Round 1

- Attach yarn at any corner
- Work sc evenly around

Round 2

- Begin shell pattern:
 - Skip stitches, work 5 dc in same stitch (shell)
 - Repeat around

Round 3

- Add chain spaces and picots where shown

Final Round

- Refine edges with sc and decorative picots

Tip: Corners should always have extra stitches to stay flat.

Step 7: Tassels (Make Multiple)

Step 1

- Wrap yarn around your hand or a small book ~20–30 times

Step 2

- Tie top securely with a separate strand

Step 3

- Cut bottom loops

Step 4

- Wrap yarn around neck of tassel and tie

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Step 5

- Trim evenly

Step 8: Attach Tassels

- Attach tassels evenly around border
- Use yarn needle or crochet hook
- Secure tightly with knots

Tip 😊: Space them evenly using stitch counts as a guide.

Step 9: Finishing

- Weave in all ends
- Block your piece lightly for shape
- Adjust edges if needed

You're Done!

You now have a complete crochet piece built from the chart:

- Circular canopy top
- Decorative panels
- Rectangular base
- Detailed border
- Tassel finish
