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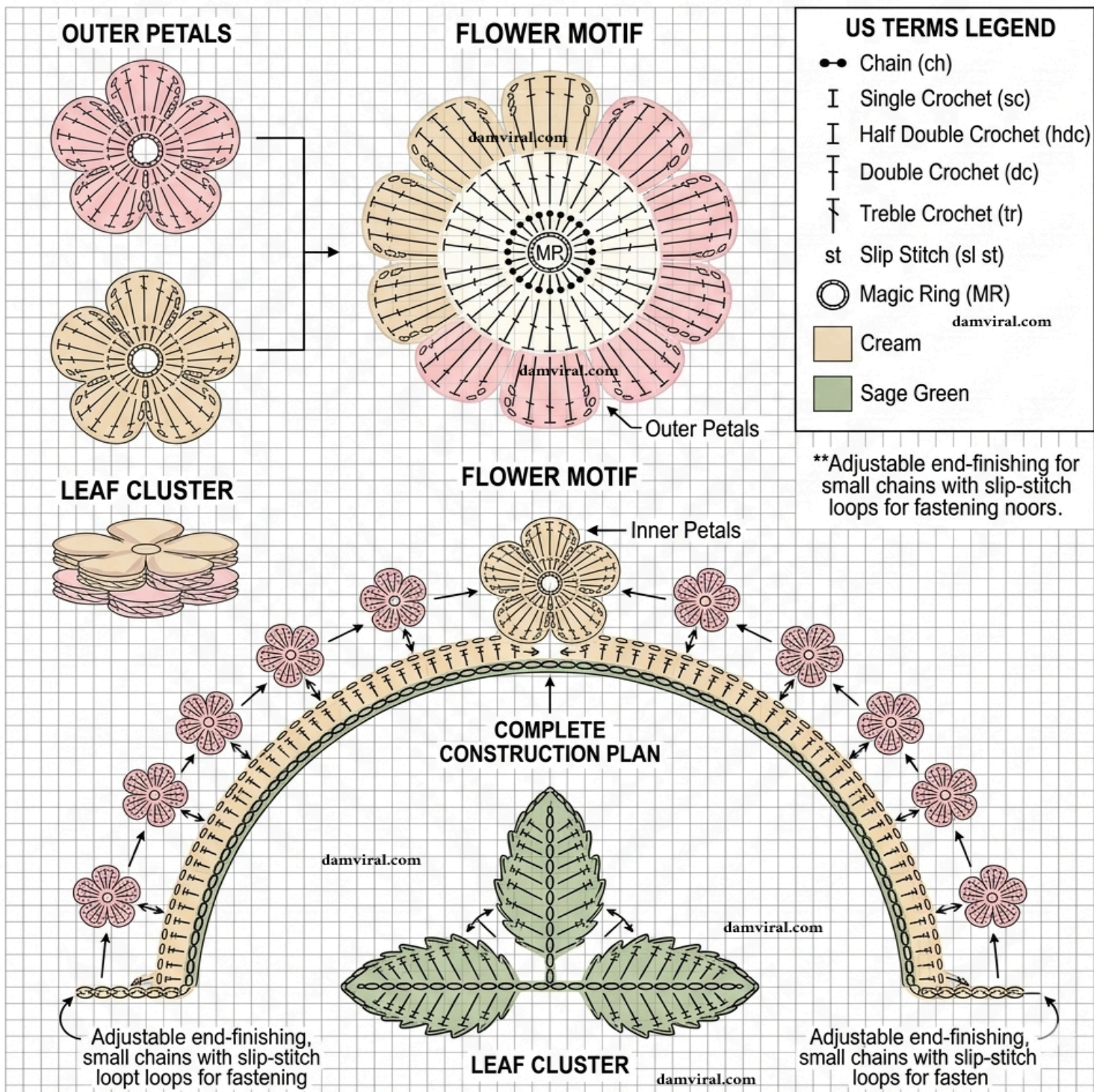
Micro-Crochet Nose Ring Ornament Pattern Tutorial

Create a delicate floral micro-crochet nose ring ornament inspired by traditional floral jewelry motifs. This tutorial follows the chart structure closely and uses standard US crochet terminology so beginners and experienced crocheters alike can complete the project successfully.

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MICRO-CROCHET NOSE RING ORNAMENT PATTERN

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Materials Needed

Before starting, gather all supplies:

- Size 80 or 100 cotton crochet thread
- Steel crochet hook size 0.4 mm–0.6 mm
- Fine embroidery scissors
- Tapestry needle
- Jewelry wire cutter (optional)
- Small jewelry pliers (optional)
- Nose ring hoop base or flexible crochet ring base
- Stitch markers
- Fabric stiffener or diluted white glue
- Blocking mat or foam board
- Sewing pins

Suggested Colors

- Cream thread
- Soft pink thread
- Sage green thread

US Crochet Abbreviations Used

- ch = chain
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- sl st = slip stitch
- MR = magic ring

Understanding the Design

This ornament is made from several components:

1. Outer flower petals
2. Inner flower motif
3. Small flower motifs
4. Leaf cluster
5. Curved base band
6. Adjustable fastening chains

The final piece combines all motifs onto a curved crochet band that sits around the nose ring structure.

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Step 1: Create the Magic Ring Center

Start every flower motif with a magic ring.

Instructions

1. Wrap thread around your finger twice.
2. Insert hook into the ring.
3. Pull up a loop.
4. Chain 1 to secure.

You now have the foundation ring.

Step 2: Crochet the Large Flower Motif

This is the main centerpiece flower shown at the top center of the chart.

Round 1 — Center Circle

Using cream thread:

1. Make MR.
2. Work 16 sc into the MR.
3. Pull ring tightly closed.
4. Join with sl st to first sc.

You should now have a compact circular center.

Step 3: Form the Petal Base

Round 2

1. Ch 3.
2. Work 1 dc into each stitch around.
3. Join with sl st.

You should now have 16 dc around the center.

Step 4: Crochet the Outer Petals

Switch to pink or cream depending on the alternating petal arrangement.

Each petal is worked over multiple stitches.

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Petal Pattern

Into the next group of stitches:

- sc
- hdc
- 5 dc
- hdc
- sc

Then sl st into the next stitch.

Repeat this sequence around to create rounded petals.

You should end with:

- 5 cream petals
- 5 pink petals alternating

Fasten off and weave in ends carefully.

Step 5: Create the Inner Petal Flower

This smaller flower sits near the top center of the ornament.

Round 1

1. Make MR.
2. Work 12 sc into MR.
3. Join with sl st.

Round 2 — Petals

For each petal:

- ch 2
- 3 dc
- ch 2
- sl st into same stitch

Repeat around for all petals.

Fasten off.

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Step 6: Make the Small Side Flowers

These miniature flowers decorate the curved band.

You will need approximately:

- 8 to 12 small flowers

Small Flower Pattern

Round 1

1. MR
2. 10 sc into ring
3. Join with sl st

Round 2

Into each stitch:

- ch 1
- 2 dc
- ch 1
- sl st

Repeat around.

Fasten off leaving a tail for sewing.

Step 7: Crochet the Leaf Cluster

Using sage green thread.

You will create:

- 2 side leaves
- 1 center leaf

Step 8: Crochet a Single Leaf

Foundation

1. Ch 10.

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Side 1

Starting in second chain from hook:

- sc in next stitch
- hdc in next
- dc across next 4 stitches
- hdc
- sc
- 3 sc in final stitch

Side 2

Working opposite side of chain:

- sc
- hdc
- dc across
- hdc
- sc

Join with sl st.

Step 9: Add Leaf Texture

To create the vein texture shown in the chart:

1. Ch 1 up the center.
2. Work sl st spine through middle.
3. Add tiny angled sl sts along each side.

This creates the realistic leaf appearance.

Repeat for all three leaves.

Step 10: Assemble the Leaf Cluster

Arrange:

- One leaf vertically in center
- Two angled outward below

Sew together securely.

Weave in all ends.

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Step 11: Crochet the Curved Base Band 🌙

Using cream thread.

This curved structure holds all motifs together.

Foundation Chain

1. Ch 90–120 depending on desired size.

Row 1

1. Work dc across entire chain.
2. Turn.

Row 2

1. Ch 1.
2. Work sl st or sc evenly across.

This creates the decorative curved edge shown in the diagram.

Shape gently into an arc while working.

Step 12: Add Decorative Edge Loops

Along the lower edge:

1. Ch 3
2. sl st into next stitch

Repeat around.

This creates the elegant loop border visible in the chart.

Step 13: Attach the Main Flower 🌸

Position the large flower at the top center of the curved band.

Using a tapestry needle:

1. Sew through the flower center.
2. Attach securely to the band.
3. Reinforce several times.

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Step 14: Attach the Small Flowers

Arrange the tiny flowers symmetrically along both sides of the curved band.

Suggested spacing:

- About 1 inch apart

Sew each flower securely.

Angle them slightly outward for a natural floral flow.

Step 15: Attach the Leaf Cluster

Center the leaf cluster beneath the large flower.

Sew securely through the middle spine of each leaf.

Ensure the leaves fan outward evenly.

Step 16: Create Adjustable End Chains

At each end of the curved band:

1. Attach thread.
2. Ch 10–15.
3. Join back with sl st loop.

Repeat to create fastening loops.

These loops allow attachment to:

- Nose ring hoops
- Hair jewelry
- Decorative chains

Step 17: Blocking the Ornament

Blocking is very important for micro-crochet work.

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Blocking Steps

1. Lightly spray the ornament with water.
2. Pin petals and leaves into shape.
3. Let dry completely.

Optional:

Apply diluted white glue or fabric stiffener for durability.

Step 18: Final Finishing

Carefully:

- Trim all loose threads
- Reinforce weak joins
- Shape petals gently
- Curve the band naturally

Your ornament should now closely resemble the original floral diagram.

Helpful Tips for Beginners

Use Bright Lighting

Micro-crochet thread is extremely fine.

Work Slowly

Tiny stitches require patience.

Count Every Stitch

Small mistakes become noticeable quickly.

Use Fine Hooks

A steel hook gives better stitch precision.

Practice Petals First

Try making one flower before assembling the entire ornament.

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Customization Ideas

You can personalize the design by:

- Using gold metallic thread
- Adding pearl beads
- Using ombré flower colors
- Making larger petals
- Adding crystal drops
- Creating matching earrings

Finished Piece Size

Approximate finished dimensions:

- Width: 4–6 inches
- Height: 2–3 inches

Depends on:

- Thread size
- Hook size
- Tension

Care Instructions

- Store flat
- Avoid moisture
- Handle gently
- Clean with soft dry cloth only
